MISSION STATEMENT

HISTORY

The Archdiocese of Miami converted the campus of St. John Vianney Seminary High School into a co-educational high school in 1975 and changed its name to St. Brendan High School. The school is committed to serving the educational needs of its students in a variety of ways. In addition to the standard curriculum, St. Brendan offers the Champagnat Program for students with special learning needs and the Alpha Program for students who have demonstrated high achievement. There are approximately 1,150 students enrolled in the school.

FACULTY

The students at St. Brendan High School are served by 90 instructors, counselors, and administrators. Fifty-five percent hold Masters, Specialists, or Doctoral degrees. Our teachers actively seek out both school-year and summer workshops which provide enriching, innovative, and creative teaching ideas. Teachers of AP courses keep up-to-date by attending workshops in their respective fields of expertise.

SCHOOL ATHLETICS & ACTIVITIES

St. Brendan High School enthusiastically participates in the Florida High School Athletic Association (FHSAA), competing interscholastically in cross-country, volleyball, swimming, basketball, soccer, softball, baseball, tennis, and track. In addition, St. Brendan students have the opportunity to participate in over 40 clubs and organizations, as well as multiple service projects on and off campus.

STUDENT BODY

Students of Hispanic descent comprise 87% of our student population. Female students comprise 74% of our student body, while male students make up 26%.
